PROTECT YOUR KIDS TWO WAYS.



Schools that will shelter in place (over pressurize) are all in Oregon—A.C. Houghton Elementary and Columbia Middle School are in Irrigon. McNary Heights Elementary, Clara Brownell Middle School and Umatilla High School are in the town of Umatilla. Hermiston has six schools that will shelter students: Rocky Heights, West Park, Highland Hills and Sunset elementary schools; Armand Larive and Sandstone middle schools; and Hermiston High School.

"At our schools, we're prepared to protect our students if there's a chemical accident at the Umatilla Chemical Depot. The over-pressurized area will filter outside air to ensure it's safe, and we have supplies to keep the kids from getting thirsty, hungry or bored. Parents should know there is no need for them to come to the schools to get their kids during an emergency because: a) your kids will be safe, b) you won't be able to get your kids anyway, and c) you could endanger your kids and other kids, not to mention yourself. Do the right thing when it matters. Let us protect your kids till any danger is over."



Two schools will evacuate in Washington—the elementary schools in Paterson and Plymouth on the Columbia River. Oregon schools that will evacuate include Sam Boardman Elementary and Riverside High School in Boardman; Hermiston Christian School and Hermiston Junior Academy; the three schools in Stanfield; and two in Echo.

Evacuation

"As hard as it may be for parents, it's very important that they trust their child will be safe with us and that they do not attempt to come to the school to pick up their child. Rather, they should follow protective actions recommended by emergency officials, so they will be safe, too. School staff and students are ready to go at a moment's notice if there's an emergency at the Depot. We have busses here at the school that we'll load all the kids into and then head up Highway 221 to the assistance center at Housel Middle School in Prosser. Letting us take care of your child is the best way to protect them. They'll be waiting for you, safe and sound, when you pick them up at the assistance center. After the danger has passed, we'll start thinking about the next step and about tomorrow's homework."
