

# IF YOUR POWER GOES OUT,



## MAKE SURE YOU'D BE WARNED. HAS YOUR BATTERY BEEN CHANGED?

- Batteries in CSEPP Tone Alert Radios (TARs) have expired.
- Batteries in CSEPP TARs need to be replaced.
- TAR batteries cannot be purchased across the counter.
- If your power goes out at the same time as a chemical or weather emergency, TARs with expired batteries will not provide warnings .

If you haven't already had your TAR battery changed, the Chemical Stockpile Emergency Preparedness Program (CSEPP) can change it quickly—free of charge. How you get your new battery depends on where you live—Oregon or Washington.
