BASIC KIT FOR HOME

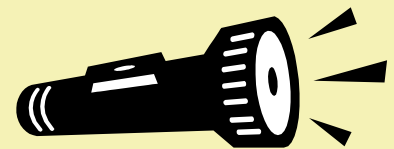
- Scissors
- Duct tape
- Plastic sheeting
- Battery-powered portable radio
- Flashlight
- First-Aid Kit*
- Snack foods
- Bottled water
- Games or books



BASIC KIT FOR EVACUATION

Here are a few items to consider packing for when you might have to evacuate. Keep them in a bag in a closet, ready to go, or keep it in your car.

- A change of clothing and shoes for each person
- First-Aid Kit*
- Medications
- Special items for babies like formula and diapers.
- Special items for elderly or disabled family members.
- Other medical supplies such as eyeglasses and dentures.
- Personal papers such as bills, bank statements and insurance policies.
- Personal hygiene items
- Checkbook, credit cards, cash
- Blankets/sleeping bags
